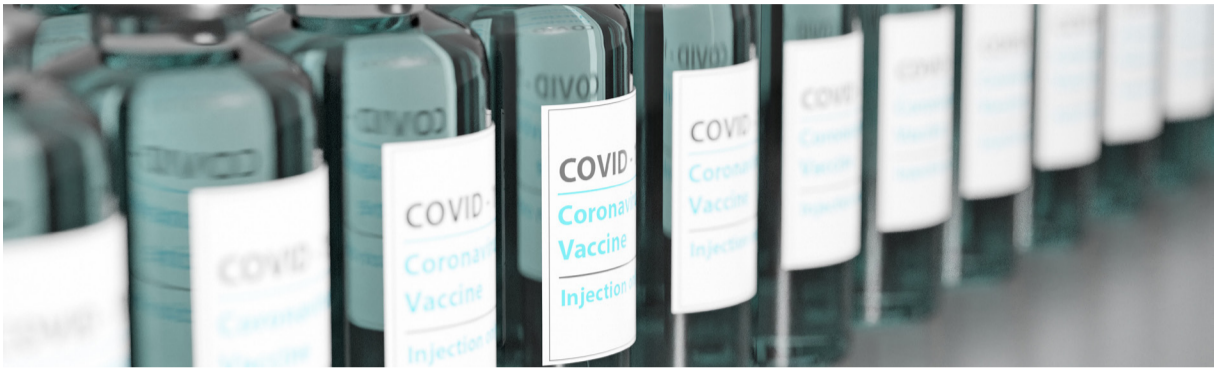


# VACCINES IN THE WORKPLACE
